- . Improved Livelihoods as well as Quality of Life
- Emphasis on Demystification of Technologies and building capacity





Programme Components:

- Core activity 'Wadi' a horti-forestry orchard converting degraded lands to Sustainable Productive Assets provide Resilience against Biotic and Abiotic risks
- Short Gestation-High Remunerative activities for food, nutrition and cash income security: Small Plot Cash crops, Floriculture, Tasar Sericulture, Inland Fishery, Sustainable management of NTFP, Aromatic crops and others
- Land Development through soil conservation and organic matter recycling
- Decentralized small scale irrigation and Water Conservation Systems
- . Integrating livestock in the farming system
- . In situ Conservation of Drought Tolerant land Races of Crops
- · Nutrition focused crops and Kitchen Gardens
