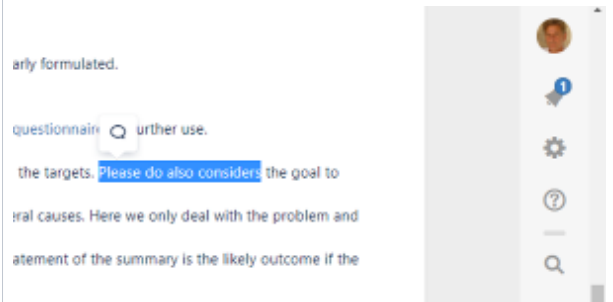
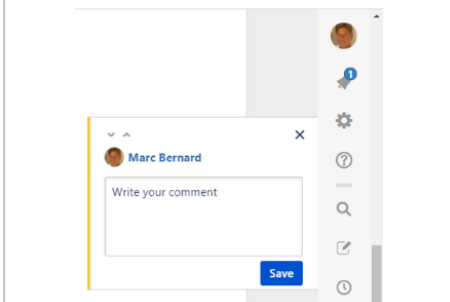

Step 1: Highlight the text that you want to comment and click on the comment symbol (speech bubble)	Step 2: Write your comment and click on "Save"
	

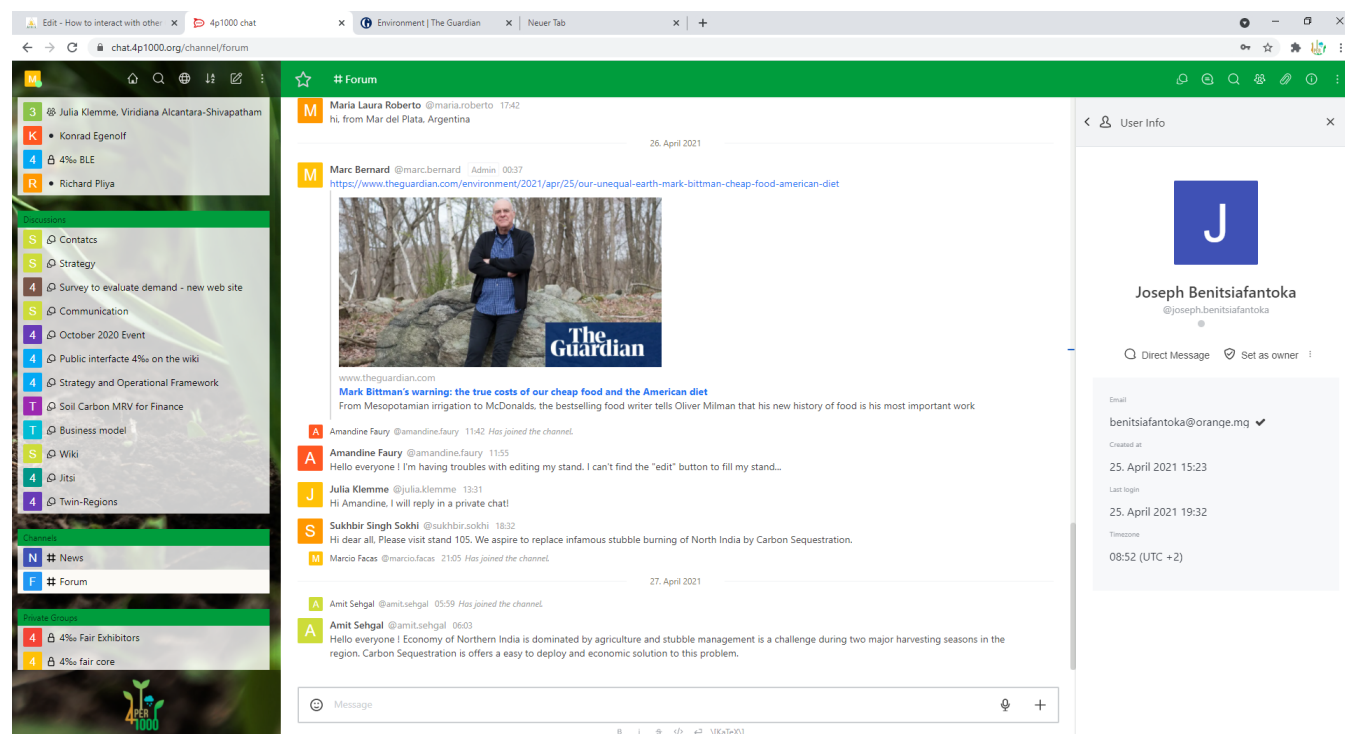
You can also **reply** to previous comments or click on **like**.
